


Solid block corner detail



Solid block corner detail

Uses: Internal and external corners

This is the most commonly used and simplest corner detail. The block can be designed either to sit 'proud' of the cladding boards to create an over-hang or sit 'shy' to create a small recess. It is not advisable to line up the block with the cladding boards exactly because a small amount of movement will be noticeable.

The position of the block can be altered by moving one of the two battens located at the corner.

Block sections are available in a range of profiles.



Fine block corner detail

Uses: Internal and external corners

For a simple and cheap method of finishing the corner, this method is ideal. The corner block can often be cut from spare cladding boards and nailed with the same fixings.

This block can be cut from a cladding board by the installer.





Uses: External corners

Done well, the mitred corner detail can look impressive, however a neat finish requires very accurate fixing of the boards and subsequent movement of the wood may spoil the appearance.
